On page five, you select the Override All Master Page Items command and move the logo to a new position. Later, you reposition and resize the logo on the A-Logo master page.

5. How can you change the color spectrum displayed in the Color Picker?

A. Click and drag anywhere inside the color spectrum display area.

B. Click inside any of the RGB, Lab, or CMYK fields.

C. Click any of the RGB or Lab options.

D. Click the Current Color box.

6. You start Bridge by clicking the Go To Bridge icon in InDesign. All Bridge preferences are set to their defaults. What happens when you select the thumbnail of a TIFF file in the Content panel of Bridge and press Enter (Windows) or Return (Mac OS)?

A. The TIFF file is imported into InDesign.

B. The TIFF file is opened in Photoshop.

C. The TIFF file is opened in the default image viewer of the operating system.

D. Bridge prompts you to choose a program to open the TIFF file.

7. Your coworker has created a logo in InDesign. The logo consists of text formatted using a paragraph style, a vector shape created in InDesign, and a TIFF image. You ask your coworker to save the logo as a snippet and send it to you by e-mail. When you receive the email, the only file attached is the snippet file.

What happens when you place the snippet into your layout?

A. The text is missing.

B. The vector shape is missing.

C. The TIFF image is missing.

D. All elements of the logo are visible.

8. You design a header for your company newsletter that consists of text elements. Each text element is on

a separate layer. Another person in your company wants to use this design and asks you to e-mail the file. They also want the design elements to appear on their original layers and in their original positions on the page. Additionally, the design elements must be able to be rearranged.

What should you do?

- A. Save the header design as a library Item and e-mail the .indl file.
- B. Save the header design as a snippet and e-mail the .inds file.

D. Select Define from the Document Preset menu. Select the CD Cover preset and choose New. Enter the correct page dimensions. Name the preset CD Cover.

- C. Create the text frame after enabling Align to Baseline Grid.
- D. Select all the text frames and create a custom baseline grid.
